Reading

- 3. Spellings (log in to Edshed) Challenge words

Optional Activities: These are some ideas for some extra activities you could do and exchange for dojo points.

In English, we are writing an information text. Our Science topic is 'Earth and Space', so the children could write their own text about some aspect of Space. When completed, we will move on to a unit based on overcoming adversity. The children could write a story about a character who has to battle against the odds in order to achieve. Read about people such as Nelson Mandela, Stephen Hawking or Malala Yousafzai.

Science- 'Earth and Space'. Maybe watch some of the excellent documentaries by Brian Cox; if possible, do some stargazing (tricky in June and July admittedly!); create a model of the Solar System. History- 'A Quest for Knowledge'. The children could visit a local library and undertake some research. Buckland Abbey would be worth a visit to find out more about Sir Francis Drake and his explorations. DT-'Flat Pack'. Investigate how boxes, etc, can be folded for easy storage and transport. The children could build a slotted model that can be taken apart and reassembled.

How can I support my child at home?

Encourage your child to complete all the homework tasks above.

Remind your child to speak to an adult in school if they find things too easy or tricky.

Have a look at the optional activities together and try to complete one of the tasks or find out more about that topic area (any extra learning is great!).

If your child is finding things difficult, remind them to have a try and persevere. We would rather that the tasks were attempted, then not completed at all.
