Optional activities

History

Find out about relatives who were evacuated or fought in WW2 – present your findings in any way that you choose, but make sure you share your findings with us!

Science

What electrical items can you find at home? Can you draw a circuit diagram to represent the rooms in your home?

PE

Practise your passes at home. Could you use a bin or box to work on your accuracy when shooting?

English

Write your own information text on a subject of your choice. Think about your layout and language choices.

Geography

We're going to be learning about ways to look after our environment. Can you think of some and design a poster for one of them?

RE

Find out about the beliefs of a family member – how does this affect their lives and choices?

How can you help your child?

Encourage them to have a try and ask a teacher if they're really stuck.

Create a routine, with dedicated time for homework – little and often is the most effective.

Support your child to be organised, but allow independence too.

Model a positive attitude towards learning, even when it is tricky.

Make sure they are confident with their times tables – regular practice on TT Rockstars and chanting them with you will help.

Use shopping as a chance to develop speed with mental addition or subtraction.

Read regularly and talk about the story. Can they explain what has happened? Do they know how the characters are feeling and why? What do they predict might happen next?

Practise spellings regularly throughout the week – EdShed or on paper.

Hold 'Spelling Bee' challenges or ask them to teach you how to play Slam Dunk Spellings.

Encourage the use of educational games on devices (eg Grammar Arcade on EdShed).
